Eesa, who is 18, had always dreamed of playing football at a high level, but didn't know it was even possible. Leber's Congenital Amaurosis (LCA), a rare eye condition, left him almost completely blind since birth. This didn't stop him from dreaming big though. And supporters like you have made his dreams a reality.

From the moment he was introduced to blind football at school, Eesa was hooked!

With the help from our Access Unlimited project, Eesa has become an England Blind Footballer, as well as playing for club team West Bromwich Albion. He also took part in last summer's World Blind Games.

His story is an inspiring example of how determination, tenacity and support can help a young person overcome challenges. We couldn't carry out the amazing work we do through our Access Unlimited project without you. You make the difference and ensure that Eesa and other blind children can achieve their dreams.

RSBC Dorton College of Further Education is our life-changing independent specialist college for vision impaired 16-25 yearolds. On 11 July, we celebrated their achievements in an uplifting ceremony at our Life Without Limits Centre.

The event celebrated the college students' hard work and achievements over the past academic year. 18 young people received certificates of achievement in subjects including media studies, politics, group enterprise, cookery, Spanish and life skills.

Student Matthew Saveljev from Bromley received the Scope Eyecare Achievement Award 2024. He said: **"I was shocked to** win this award, but I'm really happy with all I've achieved during the year."

Breaking records at the London Marathon

On Sunday 21st of April, 62 RSBC runners crossed the start line for the 44th London Marathon. Over 55,000 runners took part in the world biggest charity challenge event.

RSBC had an international team from as far away as Australia, India, USA and different parts of Europe. Our team included inspirational Bobby who has guided around the 26 mile route by his good friends Suzi and Gary.

Vision impairment was no barrier for Bobby, he was living his life without limits as he



crossed the finish line and received that coveted medal.

Our magnificent runners were cheered on by our amazing volunteers and staff member at miles 17 and 23.

This was a record-breaking team who raised an incredible £277k to help even more blind and partially sighted children live their lives without limits.
